


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LANGUAGE THROUGH STORIES

Storytelling is an effective strategy for children's approach to a language

It offers the opportunity

- to interact in meaningful and stimulating context
- to experience the language through different channels
- to develop communicative competences.

Picture books for storytelling

A picture book is a

book in which the

illustrations are as

important as the words

in telling the story.

Criteria for selecting picture books

- Pleasant to the eyes of the children.
- The language is contextualized.
- Encourage interaction.
- The topic is relevant.

Suitable structure for stories in L2

Simple (linear with a clear beginning and clear ending)

Predictable with a bit of surprise

Not too many characters

Interpreting the story

Holistic approach

Prosody and musicality

 Contextual factors that help make meaning

Adapting the story to your audience

- Using parallelism and repetitions
- Limited language patterns and structures
- Simple sentences
- Direct speech
- Re-formulate
- Concrete expressions

Creating the story

- 1. Look at the images.
- 2. Jot down a «map» of the story.
- 3. Read the story again.
- 4. Add key moments to your «map».
- 5. Remember to keep it short and simple.
- 6. Start practising telling the story using your «map», then try without looking at it.
- 7. Read the story again if you need it.
